Hasta hoy en día muchos españoles no han llegado a asimilar las experiencias vividas entre 1939 y 1975 e incluso los hijos de los que vivieron en aquella época, los que no sufrieron lo que sus padres o sus abuelos tuvieron que sufrir, están marcados por las huellas que dejó el régimen.
