2017-11-30 Karl May Die Erzählung "Old Firehand" wurde 1875 erstmals im "Deutschen Familienblatt" veröffentlicht. 1879 bearbeitete May den Text für die erste Buchausgabe eines seiner Texte, das Jugendbuch "Im fernen Westen. Zwei Erzählungen aus dem Indianerleben für die Jugend von Carl May und Fr. C. von Wickede". Im Zuge dieser Bearbeitung wurde aus dem jungen Mädchen Ellen, in das sich der Ich-Erzähler (hier noch nicht Old Shatterhand) verliebt, der Knabe Harry, jünger als Ellen. Allerdings gelang es May nicht, alle Hinweise auf die Liebesgeschichte

auszumerzen, weshalb die bearbeitete Fassung stellenweise etwas befremdlich wirkt. Auch Winnetous Gestalt wird weniger barbarisch dargestellt. In der Originalfassung skalpiert er bedenkenlos seine toten Feinde und isst den Stummel der zu Ende gerauchten Zigarre auf. 1893 nahm May diese bearbeitete Fassung als Old Firehand-Abenteuer in die Buchausgabe von Winnetou II auf.

2001 René Guénon This remarkable book grew out of a conference headed by René Guénon, the sinologist René Grousset, and the neo-Thomist Jacques Maritain on questions raised by Ferdinand Ossendowski's thrilling account in his Men, Beast and Gods of an escape through Central Asia, during which he foils enemies and encounters shamans and Mongolian lamas, whose marvels he describes. The book caused a great sensation, especially the closing chapters, where Ossendowski recounts legends allegedly entrusted to him concerning the 'King of the World' and his subterranean kingdom Agartha. The present book, one of Guénon's most controversial, was written in response to this conference and develops the theme of the King of the World from the point of view of traditional metaphysics. Chapters include: Western Ideas about Agartha; Shekinah and Metatron; The Three Supreme Functions; Symbolism of the Grail; Melki-Tsedeq; Luz: Abode of Immortality; The Supreme Center concealed during the Kali-Yuga; and The Omphalos and Sacred Stones .

2020-11-17 James Fenimore Cooper The Deerslayer, or The First War-Path (1841) was the last of James Fenimore Cooper's Leatherstocking Tales to be written. Its 1740-1745 time period makes it the first installment chronologically and in the lifetime of the hero of the Leatherstocking tales, Natty Bumppo. The novel's setting on Otsego Lake in central, upstate New York, is the same as that of The Pioneers, the first of the Leatherstocking Tales to be published (1823). The Deerslayer is considered to be the prequel to the rest of the series. Fenimore Cooper begins his work by relating the astonishing advance of civilization in New York State, which is the setting of four of his five Leatherstocking Tales.
